Message from Presiding Bishop Michael Curry on Lambeth Call on human dignity

I did want to talk with you—just briefly, especially for our LGBTQ family. I know that there is legitimately some anxiety and concern about the conversations and the direction that might emerge from this Lambeth Conference, specifically regarding same-sex marriage. I want you to know, though, that at the end of this day, when we did discuss same-sex marriage and marriage in general, in the context of talking about human dignity, and the ministry of reconciliation in Christ, I left that conversation hopeful. I left it hopeful, not because we all came to agreement across all of our differences. No, no, we didn't even try to do that. I left hopeful not because I convinced anybody of where I stand, or that they convinced me of where they stand. I left hopeful because this group of bishops today seem to be able to recognize and affirm our love and respect for each other as brothers and sisters in Christ in the body of Jesus Christ. And that we could find a way to honor and respect our differences. If we love each other, and love our Lord. That, my friends, is a sign of hope. That is a sign of hope. That makes room and space for all of us to be in the course of our conversations.



Scripture Reflections

Reflection on the Gospel by David J Schlafer from Daily Feast: Meditations from Feasting on the Word

Being rich toward God is not primarily about putting sizable sums in the offering plate. Making moth- and thief-proof purses is not merely a better business strategy than building bigger barns. What Jesus enjoins, rather, is an orientation toward the whole of life as abundant gift from a generous God—a gift that can, therefore, be given away with abandon. Neither receiving nor sharing is possible when hands are grasped and fingers clenched.



Reflection on the Isaiah by Stacy Simpson Duke from Daily Feast: Meditations from Feasting on the Word

A word such as this does not lose its relevance, because this is always a core problem for God's people—the gap between our practice and our praise. "How can you worship a homeless man on Sunday and ignore one on Monday?" the poster at the homeless shelter asks. The poster may seem glib, but it does point to our perpetual problem: translating our worship into action. Our inattention to injustice delegitimates our praise.

If we want to lift our blood-soaked hands to God, there is only one thing left to do: "Wash yourselves; make yourselves clean" (v. 16). What is required to come clean before God? "Cease to do evil, learn to do good; seek justice" (vv. 16–17). In the broadest terms, it is the turning of a life and the turning of a community of lives.

In specific terms, doing good and seeking justice look like this: "rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow" (v. 17). If the people of God want to lift their hands to God in prayer, they will extend their hands to the most vulnerable as well.
