
# CHURCH OF THE REDEEMER Eblast April 18, 2024



#### **Scripture Reflection**

#### **Reflection on the Gospel by Nancy R Blakely from Daily Feast: Meditations from Feasting on the Word**

When someone is having a difficult time, we casually give the advice to "hang in there." Those are not very helpful words for one who desperately wonders how to do just that. Jesus offers so much more than hanging in there. Yes, hard times will invariably come, but living, abiding, finding our home in Jesus the vine and God the grower sustains us, promoting even greater well-being. Recall the Hebrew notion of shalom, which speaks of wholeness, completeness, and health. Recovering that sense of shalom addresses the deep yearnings of our lives. Shalom enters into all the cuts and hurts we endure day to day. It even enables us to speak of healing when there is no hope for a cure. Hope for relief from suffering does remain—a hope that God's miracles of growth bring to fruition. What connections do you make between the concept of abiding and the Hebrew notion of shalom?

#### Central New York Bishop DeDe Duncan-Probe named petition nominee for 28th presiding bishop



[Episcopal News Service] Central New York Bishop DeDe Duncan-Probe on April 16 was <u>added as a</u> <u>nominee by petition</u> to stand for election as The Episcopal Church's 28th presiding bishop, joining four other bishops who were <u>announced two weeks ago on</u> <u>the initial slate</u> of nominees to succeed Presiding Bishop Michael Curry.

The two-week petition period closed at the end of the day April 15, and Duncan-Probe was the sole petition nominee. She joins Nebraska Bishop J. Scott Barker, Pennsylvania Bishop Daniel G.P. Gutiérrez, Atlanta Bishop Robert Wright and Northwestern Pennsylvania Bishop Sean Rowe, who also serves as bishop provisional of the Diocese of Western New York.
