SAYRE BOROUGH NEWS SUMMER 2025 CELEBRATING 40 YEARS OF MUSIC IN THE PARK

The 40th year of the William S. Pierce Memorial-Sayre Summer Concert Series kicked off the Borough's Summer Event Schedule on June 18th with the first of eleven performances on the historic bandstand in Howard Elmer Park at 6:30pm. This year's concert series includes performances that offer something for everyone. Several of this year's performances will include longtime concert series favorites, we are excited to welcome Jeremy James on July 2nd and the O.Gs on July 16th to the series line-up.

The first of three Downtown Summer Splash events will be held on Friday, June 27th with performances by local musician Jenna Buck and the Uptown Music Collective from Williamsport, PA. The Summer Splash on July 25th will include a performance by Into the Spin, and the Summer Splash on August 22nd will mark the return of Avalanche which is the rock band component of the U.S. Army Band – 10th Mountain Division at Fort Drum, NY. The June Summer Splash will feature a fireworks display at 9:15pm and all of the Splash events will include restaurant specials and local food vendors.

The 12th Annual End of Summer Celebration presented by Gannon Associates will be held on Saturday, August 23rd. The End of Summer Celebration will include local food vendors, activities for kids, back to school supply give-a-ways and live music with Jeremy James, Mike & Tate, and Doc Possum. The June and August fireworks display soundtracks will be broadcast on Wiggle 100.3fm & wiggle100.com.



The Borough Council and the Sayre Borough Volunteer Fire Department implemented an incentive program in 2024 for Fire Department members that is designed to reward firefighters and fire police personnel for responding to emergencies and for their time on other Department responsibilities including public service calls, training, company meetings, and special events. More than \$13,300.00 was provided to Department members in 2024 and an additional \$3,800.00 was provided to members for

their service during the first quarter of 2025. The Fire Department is always looking for new members and there



Annual Paving Project To Begin in July



The Borough's 2025 paving project is scheduled to begin in the second week of July weather permitting. The \$477,000.00 project was awarded to Bishop Brothers Construction and includes milling and paving of more than a mile of roadway. The cost of the project is funded by the General Fund, Local Service Tax, and Pennsylvania Liquid Fuels revenue. This year's paving project includes West Lockhart Street between Hospital Place and North Hopkins Street; Cedar Street between 107 Cedar Street and Beech Terrace; North

Lehigh Avenue between Bradford Street and 250' South of the intersection; Mohawk Street between Cedar Street and Hemlock Road; Poplar Street between Lynch Street and Cypress Street, Frank Street between Sunset Street and Fordham Street, Harris Street between Peck Street and Frank Street, Hemlock Road between 117 Hemlock Road to a point 350' Southbound, Johnson Street between Summit Street and Linden Street, and Lewis Street between Summit Street and Linden Street. The project could take up to two weeks to complete. Updates will be posted on the Borough's Facebook page.


