WE NEED YOU!

In his first letter to the Corinthians, the Apostle Paul writes:

²¹ The eye can't say to the hand, "I don't need you!" The head can't say to the feet, "I don't need you!" ²² In fact, it is just the opposite. The parts of the body that seem to be weaker are the ones we can't do without. ²³ The parts that we think are less important we treat with special honor. The private parts aren't shown. But they are treated with special care. ²⁴ The parts that can be shown don't need special care. But God has put together all the parts of the body. And he has given more honor to the parts that didn't have any. ²⁵ In that way, the parts of the body will not take sides. All of them will take care of one another. ²⁶ If one part suffers, every part suffers with it. If one part is honored, every part shares in its joy.

²⁷ You are the body of Christ. Each one of you is a part of it. (12:21-27)

As part of the body of Christ, our leadership needs your voice, your ideas, and your concerns about whether our partnership with the St. John should change. Being responsive to some who would like us to worship together year round, Vestry and Council need to be aware of the opportunities such a change would offer as well as have as much awareness as possible what pitfalls lie before us. Both Vestry and Council want to listen carefully and prayerfully to the thoughts of our members before any type of decision is made. Both bodies can come up with reasons why we shouldn't do this while acknowledging how wonderful the church feels when it is full.

For these reasons, Vestry and Council want to have a series of conversations with our congregants on the pros and cons of taking the step of worshipping together beyond the summer months. During our **potluck** gathering on **Sunday October 12**, we hope to identify what some of the pros and cons might be. From there my hope is that there will be congregants willing to form small working groups in order to tackle the points raised and brain storm ideas to address those points. The results from each working group would be shared with the congregations, allowing the opportunity for further refinement. We anticipate that there would be several opportunities for the two parishes to gather outside of worship to share opinions, insights, gratitude, and concerns before we would have two separate congregational meetings (one for each congregation) for a final vote. **Please make every effort to attend our joint worship service on October 12th at 10 am at St. John and participate in our potluck fellowship. We are aware it is a holiday weekend and you may be out-of-town. In that case, rest assured there will be other opportunities to make your thoughts known.**

On a personal note, my goal for my two congregations is to see us thrive and grow in our relationship with each other and in Christ. Together or apart, we are called to share the Good News of the Gospel. Do I love presiding at worship with a larger congregation—yes. At the same time, my call is to serve you and whatever the decision is, I know that we will thoughtfully and prayerfully engage the question, allowing the Holy Spirit to lead us.




Sunday, October 5th at 2pm Muldoon Park in Waverly (We'll gather across the street in the event of rain.)




