# **Scripture Reflection**

On the Sunday closest to October 31, Lutherans the world over commemorate the Reformation. This particular date is significant as it is the date Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the church door in Wittenberg in 1517. Recall that the next day, November 1 is All Saints Day, a significant religious holiday in the life of the church and Luther knew worship would be well attended and his theses well read.

The Reformation, however, did not start on a single date and did not conclude within a single month or year. Historical scholarship generally recognizes the Reformation to have occurred between the years 1517 and 1648. In that time, religious wars were fought and religious thought leaders executed. The power of the church hierarchy was supplanted by secular, political power and the modern state began to take shape. Important theologians of the era included Jan Hus, Martin Luther, Philip Melanchtahon, Huldrych Zwingli, John Calvin, Desiderius Erasmus, John Knox, and Thomas Cranmer. While none of them sought to begin a new denomination, they became the founders of Anabaptists (Baptist, Amish, Mennonites), Lutherans, Presbyterians and Anglicans.

Historians of Christianity suggest that the church reforms itself every 500 years. By 451, the Council of Chalcedon settled major religious dogma and we now have the Nicene Creed in its final form. In 1054 the Eastern (Orthodox) Church and the western (Roman) church separated over irreconcilable differences in theology and worship. In 1517, what we call the Reformation got fully underway. The Church writ large finds greater society shifting faster than the Church can keep up. Church growth has changed from the northern and western hemisphere to the Global South. In what ways do you see the church undergoing change and transformation? In what ways do you see God reforming and re-energizing God's people?
