

Friday, November 28, 2025, 3:00 pm thru Saturday, November 29, 2025,



SCRIPTURE REFLECTION



The prophet Jeremiah warns of shepherds who will destroy and scatter God's people (Jer. 23:1–2). How do we discern the difference between shepherds who have come to scatter and shepherds who have been raised up by God? How do the stories of Zechariah's prophecy and Jesus' crucifixion

affirm the ways we declare the kingship of Jesus? Paul declares that peace was made through the blood of the cross (Col. 1:20). How do we think about the inherent violence in the crucifixion? Is there a way to reconcile the call to be peacemakers with this statement that peace comes through the blood of the cross?






Slow down. Quiet. It's Advent.



Slow Down, Quiet, It's Advent calendars are available on the table in the church. Please feel free to take one home with you. They are much bigger than this picture depicts.




