Find Comfort and Hope: Christ Church to Host "Blue Christmas" Service for Those Struggling This Holiday Season Sunday December 7 2pm

TOWANDA, PA - The holiday season, often portrayed as a time of unbridled joy and celebration, can be a time of profound sadness, grief, and loneliness for many in our community. Recognizing that not everyone is feeling "merry and bright," Christ Church is offering a special "Blue Christmas" service on December 7th at 2 pm. This quiet, contemplative service, also sometimes known as a "Longest Night" service, is a sacred space where individuals can bring their authentic feelings of pain, loss, and struggle without the pressure to put on a happy face. It is open to everyone, regardless of church affiliation, who may be navigating a difficult time, such as: Grieving the loss of a loved one, dealing with the pain of separation or broken relationships, coping with job loss, health issues, or other significant changes in life, experiencing loneliness or depression amidst the holiday festivities, feeling overwhelmed by the state of the world or personal worries. The service will include periods of silence, reflective music, candle lighting, and scripture readings that acknowledge the reality of human suffering and point toward the enduring hope and comforting presence of God, even in our darkest moments. "The Christmas story reminds us that God came to dwell among us, in the midst of our human experience—including the pain and the mess," said Reverend Betsy Sentigar of Christ Church, "Our Blue Christmas service provides a safe, supportive place to acknowledge our sorrow and to be reminded that we are not alone in our grief. God is with us, and so is our community." All members of the community and their friends are invited to attend this service to find solace, strength, and a renewed sense of peace this Advent season.
