SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Advent IV (December 21)

In Romans, Paul defines himself according to 1) who Jesus is (promised through the prophets,) 2) what Jesus gives (grace and apostleship,) and 3) why Jesus is for all people (to foster faith.) How do those qualities and gifts inform your own definition of self? How might you amend, or more greatly appreciate, your own self-image and the image you have of others because of Jesus?

Pay particular attention to the Gospel account of Jesus' birth in Matthew's Gospel. Notice that it is different from the familiar story we have in Luke. Why might the stories be different?



HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE ORGAN & HARP CONCERT



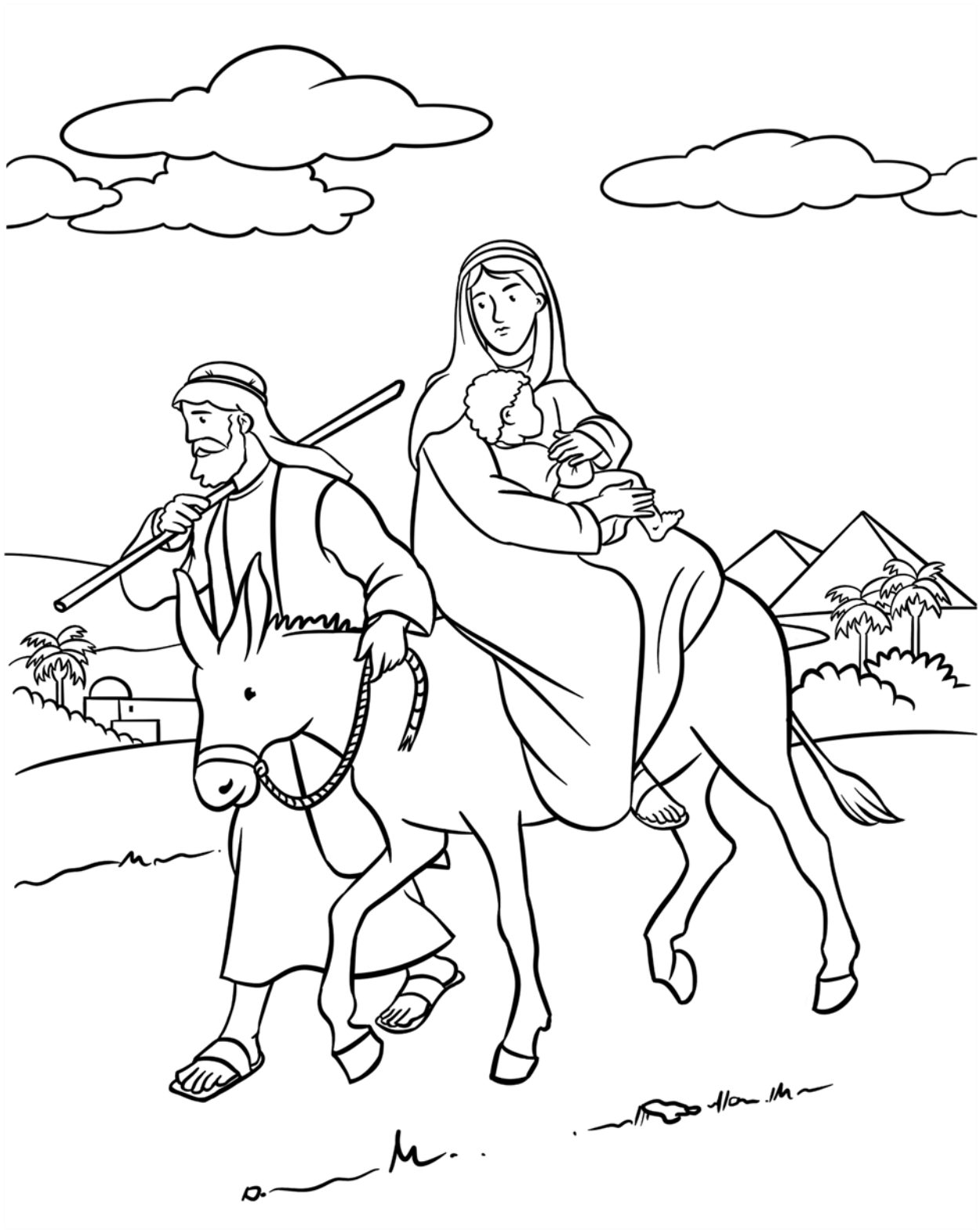
Last Sunday afternoon, we hosted a well-received organ and harp concert performed by Mr. Ted Davenport of Apalachin, NY. Ted is primarily self-taught and although he can read music, prefers to play by ear. Approximately 45 people attended and we were especially pleased that residents of Sayre Health Care (SHC) were amongst the audience. It is through SHC that we learned of Ted. Former parishioner Joanne Lumley has a sister, Jean Swett, who is a resident there. Last Spring she mentioned to Ted, who performs at SHC, that he might enjoy playing our organ. He called, Marcella was agreeable, and he has practiced on our organ almost weekly since then. In thanksgiving he offered to perform a Christmas Concert for us and oh, what a concert!

First, he played the organ for about 45 minutes. He began with a medley that included the *Little Drummer Boy*, followed by variations on *In the Deep Midwinter*, and then a waltz of his own composition. He concluded with a Scots-Irish tune that his recently departed mother especially loved.

After playing the organ, he moved to his harp for about a half an hour – a beautiful instrument he purchased in Italy. He began with *Away in a Manger* (Cradle Song version), *O Tannenbaum* (*O Christmas Tree!*), and *Bring A Torch Jeanette Isabella*. Next, he performed childhood favorites *Up on the House Top*, *Jolly Old St. Nicholas*, and *Jingle Bells*. Then his next choice took our breath away as he began *O Holy Night* and then slid into Leonard Cohen's *Alleluia* then back to *O Holy Night*. He followed this by playing five more favorite carols and concluded with *Jesus Loves Me*. The crowd loved him and gave him an ovation.

This particular performance was one of Ted's last, as he is relocating to Florida in February.
